As face-to-face prison visits start to open again, some people will be seeing their family member in person for the first time in over a year. Pray that relationships will be rebuilt easily and well.

Please pray for elderly family members who support a loved one in prison. Pray they would have sufficient grace for each day.

Pray for many families experiencing deep loneliness. Please pray it will not always be this way. Pray for new and good relationships and restoration of old ones.

## Aftercare - Men

Pray for churches as they begin to operate in the community again. Pray for safety for them and that they will reach out to those most in need, including those released from prison.

Pray for men who are looking for work. It is especially hard for those who have convictions to find employment. Pray for employers to look at the potential of the employee rather than his past.

Pray for those who are sick. Many men are struggling with health issues and access to health care. Pray especially for those in hospital right now, and anyone who is trying to visit, but cannot.

Those with addictions are really struggling and many have no access to support or very limited support over the telephone. Pray for help for those in crisis. Pray for the organisations and people in the community, who help with addictions, to be funded and supported to do this lifesaving work.

## Aftercare - Women

Give thanks for a really special time together on 'Kirsty's Walk'. Pray that God would continue to move in the hearts and lives of all who were there, and for continued comfort for Kirsty's family.

Pray for 'M' who is nearing the end of a lengthy sentence. Pray especially for a suitable place to live and good support.

Pray for women who have had their children removed from their care. They often acknowledge their mistakes, and know this is for the best, but it is incredibly painful.

Pray that the most broken and vulnerable we work with will accept help and support. They often can 'hide away' during the darkest times.

Many of the women we work with are desperately trying to break free from addiction. Pray that they will keep strong, believe in themselves and know there is always hope.

Pray for released women to find the support they need to thrive and not return to prison.
