Family

Give thanks for the interest the men have for the Friday night meeting in Magilligan. Many come faithfully and listen to testimony, song, and God's Word. Pray this continues, and that God will work in the lives of these men in prison and when they are released.

Aftercare - Women

Pray that Lynne would be able to get in touch with N. We weren't able to deliver her Christmas hamper, and she hasn't responded to any contact. This is very worrying. Pray that wherever N is, she would remember her true worth.

Pray for C whose little son is very, very sick (end of life). C is naturally very upset but has been open to support and prayer. Pray for Lynne as she does her best to love and support in this heart-breaking situation.

Pray for R, who after a very lengthy, patient wait, has just moved into her new home - the first home of her own. She has been doing so, so well, clean of alcohol, drugs, and crime. Pray that this new home will be a place of refuge and peace, and R would stay strong.

Aftercare - Men

Please pray for D. His friend and neighbour passed away at Christmas. Pray for D as he grieves and takes time to adjust. 'Blessed are those who mourn for they will be comforted.'
